PRESS RELEASE Hoboken Police arrest 24 in months-long narcotics investigation

Hoboken Police Chief Steven Aguiar and the Hoboken Police Department (HPD) announced today the arrest of 24 individuals, following a two-month long investigation into illegal drug activity on and around the 300 block of Jackson Street. The HPD Detective Bureau's Street Crimes Unit, under the supervision of Sgt. William Collins, initiated the investigation in response to numerous community complaints about suspected drug sales, and frequent loitering in the area.

"These arrests are the direct result of residents speaking up. We hear your concerns, and we will continue to take action to address them," **said Chief Aguiar**. "Illegal drugs do not belong in Hoboken, and the Hoboken Police Department will not tolerate any illegal activity that puts our community at risk or impacts quality of life. I thank and commend those who came forward to report these crimes and I am grateful to the dedicated members of the Street Crimes Unit, and all of HPD, who continue working to make Hoboken an even safer City."

During the investigation, which began in early April, Detectives conducted extensive surveillance operations, using unmarked vehicles and plainclothes officers, leading to multiple arrests over the course of several weeks. Nine of those arrested face more serious charges related to the distribution of a controlled dangerous substance (CDS), distribution within 500 feet of public housing, and distribution within 1,000 feet of a school. These individuals include:

If convicted of the most serious charges, those listed above face up to 10 years in prison.

As a result of the investigation, 15 others were also arrested and charged with lesser crimes such as possession of CDS and possession of drug paraphernalia, including:

During the arrests, HPD also seized illegal narcotics including 35.6 grams of crack cocaine and 105.6 grams of heroin along with \$688 in cash believed to have been proceeds of illegal drug sales.
